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Title of practice	Leadership and Management Training
Key features:	Finland has adopted a system of management and leadership training, providing continuous management training every year to all levels of leadership in their organisations. The main target of the management training has been to adapt the leaders to the 'management by results' system operating in the state administration, and to strengthen their competences in leadership, personnel management, creating a good work climate etc. In addition, senior judges have also been given training in the competences necessary to lead the application of law by setting the goals for each court
Institution contact details	with their resident judges, including such matters as case allocation, balancing the workload of judges, the need for uniformity in the handling times of cases and the application of law, and dealing with independence issues. Ministry of Justice Postal address: Po Box 25
