The European Judicial Network (in criminal matters) is a network of national contact points in the EU Member States designated among central authorities and other competent authorities, with specific responsibilities in the field of judicial cooperation in criminal matters.

The role of the EJM (in criminal matters) is to facilitate judicial cooperation in criminal matters, by providing legal and practical advice and to assist in establishing direct contacts between national competent authorities. The EJM Contact Points are also involved in and promote the organisation of training sessions on judicial cooperation in criminal matters.
