Erstatning til ofre for forbrydelser

Nationale oplysninger og onlineformularer vedrørende direktiv 2004/80/EF

Generelle oplysninger

Rådets direktiv 2004/80/EF af 29. april 2004 om erstatning til ofre for forbrydelser

Direktivet finder anvendelse i alle medlemsstater i Den Europæiske Union.

I direktivet er der fastsat krav om, at hver enkelt EU-medlemsstat skal indføre en national ordning for erstatning til alle ofre for forsætlige voldsforbrydelser. Alle ofre for forsætlige voldsforbrydelser skal herved have adgang til den nationale erstatningsordning i den medlemsstat, på hvis område forbrydelsen blev begået.

For at hjælpe ofre for forsætlige voldsforbrydelser med at få adgang til erstatning i sager, der går på tværs af grænserne, indføres der ved direktivet en samarbejdsordning mellem de nationale myndigheder:

Personer, der udsættes for kriminalitet, mens de er i udlandet (i et EU-land, hvor de ikke bor), kan indsende ansøgningen til den **bistandsydende myndighed** i den stat, hvor de bor (vælg "bistandsydende myndigheder" i søgeværktøjet nedenfor).

Den bistandsydende myndighed oversætter og fremsender ansøgningen til den **besluttende myndighed** i den medlemsstat, hvor forbrydelsen blev begået (vælg "besluttende myndigheder" i søgeværktøjet nedenfor). Den besluttende myndighed er ansvarlig for at behandle ansøgningen og udbetale erstatning. De bistandsydende og de besluttende myndigheder kommunikerer med hinanden på **de sprog, som de har accepteret**. For at finde oplysninger om det/de accepterede sprog skal du se på den medlemsstat, hvori den myndighed, som de relevante oplysninger for sagen skal sendes til (såsom ansøgningen, afgørelsen eller andre meddelelser), er beliggende.

De bistandsydende og de besluttende myndigheder modtager bistand fra **de centrale kontaktpunkter** (vælg "centralt kontaktpunkt" i søgeværktøjet nedenfor), hvis rolle det er at fremme samarbejdet mellem myndighederne, yde bistand og søge løsninger i grænseoverskridende situationer.

They should enclose copies of any documents in support of their compensation claim (copy of the police report, any court decisions that may have been handed down, supporting documents proving their total incapacity for work, permanent disability, increase in outgoings or reduction in income, and documents describing their disability, to ensure that they receive effective and adequate compensation from the offender).

Compensation to crime victims - Slovakia

Section 20(1) of Act No 274/2017 on victims of crime and amending certain acts states that '*the documents and information referred to in Sections 18 and 19 shall be transmitted in the official language, or in one of the official languages, of the Member State whose authority is being addressed, or in another language whose use has been approved by that Member State, with the exception of the following:*

(a) *decisions taken by the decision-making body, which shall be drawn up in the language determined by its legal order;*

(b) *statements made by victims of a violent crime or by other persons referred to in Section 18(6)(b) and Section 19(4)(b), which shall be drawn up in the language of the Member State, as determined by its assisting authority.*

Section 20(2) of Act No 274/2017 states that '*subject to the conditions referred to in paragraph 1, documents and information addressed to the Slovak authorities shall be transmitted in Slovak and English.*'
