Allgemeine Informationen

Richtlinie 2004/80/EG des Rates vom 29. April 2004 zur Entschädigung der Opfer von Straftaten

Die Richtlinie gilt für alle Mitgliedstaaten der Europäischen Union.

Gemäß der Richtlinie sind alle EU-Mitgliedstaaten verpflichtet, eine nationale Regelung zu erlassen, die eine Entschädigung aller Opfer vorsätzlicher Gewalttaten gewährleistet. Alle Opfer vorsätzlich begangener Gewalttaten haben Zugang zur nationalen Entschädigungsregelung in dem Mitgliedstaat, in dessen Hoheitsgebiet die Straftat begangen wurde.

Zur Unterstützung der Opfer vorsätzlicher Straftaten beim Zugang zu Entschädigungen in grenzüberschreitenden Fällen wird mit der Richtlinie ein System für die Zusammenarbeit zwischen nationalen Behörden geschaffen.

Personen, die im Ausland (in einem EU-Mitgliedstaat, in dem sie nicht leben) Opfer einer Straftat werden, können den Antrag bei der **Unterstützungsbehörde** in dem Land stellen, in dem sie leben (siehe unter „Unterstützungsbehörde“ in der Suchfunktion unten).

Die Unterstützungsbehörde übersetzt und übermittelt den Antrag der **Entscheidungsbehörde** des Mitgliedstaats, in dem die Straftat begangen wurde (siehe unter „Entscheidungsbehörde“ in der Suchfunktion unten). Die Entscheidungsbehörde ist für die Bewertung des Antrags und die Zahlung der Entschädigung zuständig.

Die Unterstützungsbehörde und die Entscheidungsbehörde kommunizieren **in den von ihnen vereinbarten Sprachen** miteinander. Informationen über die vereinbarte(n) Sprache(n) finden Sie auf der Seite zum jeweiligen Mitgliedstaat der Behörde, an die die einschlägigen Informationen (z. B. Antrag, Entscheidung oder Mitteilung) übermittelt werden.

Languages for the transmission of applications

The Criminal Injury Compensation Board (*'Erstatningsnævnet'*) accepts Danish or English for applications to Denmark.

Denmark has concluded a Language Convention with the other Nordic countries, i.e. Finland, Iceland, Norway and Sweden, under which citizens of these countries may use their own language in another Nordic country. The languages included in the Convention are Danish, Finnish, Icelandic, Norwegian and Swedish.

Application forms for compensation

In Luxembourg, people seeking compensation are not required to complete a specific form.

Victims of a crime simply need to send a letter giving the date, place and details of the crime.

They should enclose copies of any documents in support of their compensation claim (copy of the police report, any court decisions that may have been handed down, supporting documents proving their total incapacity for work, permanent disability, increase in outgoings or reduction in income, and documents describing their disability, to ensure that they receive effective and adequate compensation from the offender).
