### Informazioni generali

**Direttiva 2004/80/CE del Consiglio, del 29 aprile 2004, relativa all'indennizzo delle vittime di reato**

La direttiva si applica a tutti gli Stati membri dell'Unione europea.

La direttiva stabilisce che ciascun Stato membro istituisca un regime nazionale di indennizzo delle vittime di tutti i reati intenzionali violenti. In base alla presente norma tutte le vittime di reati intenzionali violenti hanno accesso al sistema nazionale di indennizzo nello Stato membro sul cui territorio il reato è stato commesso.

Per aiutare le vittime di reati intenzionali violenti ad avere accesso all'indennizzo nei casi transfrontalieri, la direttiva istituisce un sistema di cooperazione tra le autorità nazionali:

Le vittime della criminalità mentre si trovano all'estero (in uno Stato membro dell'UE in cui non vivano) possono presentare domanda all'**autorità di assistenza** nello Stato in cui vivono (si prega di selezionare «autorità di assistenza» nello strumento di ricerca).

L'autorità di assistenza traduce e trasmette la domanda all'**autorità di decisione** nello Stato membro in cui il reato è stato commesso (si prega di selezionare «autorità di decisione» nello strumento di ricerca). L'autorità competente è responsabile della valutazione della domanda e del versamento della compensazione.

Le autorità di assistenza e di decisione comunicano tra di loro nelle **lingue che hanno accettato**. Per trovare informazioni sulle lingue accettate occorre prendere in considerazione l'autorità dello Stato membro a cui sono inviate le informazioni pertinenti (ad esempio, decisione o altro tipo di comunicazione).

Le autorità di assistenza e di decisione sono assistite dai **punti di contatto centrali** nazionali (si prega di selezionare «punto di contatto centrale» nello strumento di ricerca qui di seguito), il cui ruolo è favorire la cooperazione tra le autorità competenti, prestare assistenza e cercare soluzioni in situazioni transfrontaliere.

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### Compensation to crime victims - Czechia

Victims of a crime simply need to send a letter giving the date, place and details of the crime.

They should enclose copies of any documents in support of their compensation claim (copy of the police report, any court decisions that may have been handed down, supporting documents proving their total incapacity for work, permanent disability, increase in outgoings or reduction in income, and documents describing their disability, to ensure that they receive effective and adequate compensation from the offender).

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#### Compensation to crime victims - Slovakia

##### Languages for the transmission of applications

Section 20(1) of Act No 274/2017 on victims of crime and amending certain acts states that *'the documents and information referred to in Sections 18 and 19 shall be transmitted in the official language, or in one of the official languages, of the Member State whose authority is being addressed, or in another language whose use has been approved by that Member State, with the exception of the following:*

*(a) decisions taken by the decision-making body, which shall be drawn up in the language determined by its legal order;*

*(b) statements made by victims of a violent crime or by other persons referred to in Section 18(6)(b) and Section 19(4)(b), which shall be drawn up in the language of the Member State, as determined by its assisting authority.'*

Section 20(2) of Act No 274/2017 states that *'subject to the conditions referred to in paragraph 1, documents and information addressed to the Slovak authorities shall be transmitted in Slovak and English.'*
