**Padomes Direktīva 2004/80/EK (2004. gada 29. aprīlis) par kompensāciju noziegumos cietušajiem**

Direktīvu piemēro visās Eiropas Savienības dalībvalstīs.

Direktīvā noteikts, ka katra ES dalībvalsts izveido valsts kompensāciju sistēmu, no kuras izmaksā kompensāciju visiem tišos, vardarbīgos noziegumos cietušajiem. Saskaņā ar šo tiesību aktu visiem tišos, vardarbīgos noziegumos cietušajiem ir piekļuve tās dalībvalsts kompensāciju sistēmai, kuras teritorijā ir izdarīts noziegums.

Lai palīdzētu tišos, vardarbīgos noziegumos cietušajiem pieprasīt kompensāciju pārrobežu lietās, ar direktīvu ir izveidota sadarbības sistēma starp valstu iestādēm.

Ja persona, atrodoties ārzemēs (ES dalībvalstī, kurā viņa nedzīvo), ir cietusi noziedzīgā nodarījumā, viņa var iesniegt pieteikumu **palīģiestādei** savas dzīvesvietas dalībvalstī (lūdzu, izvēlieties "Palīģiestādes" meklēšanas rīkā zemāk).

Palīģiestāde pārtulko un nosūta pieteikumu **lēmēģiestādei** dalībvalstī, kurā izdarīts noziegums (lūdzu, izvēlieties "Lēmēģiestādes" meklēšanas rīkā zemāk).

Lēmēģiestāde ir atbildīga par pieteikuma izvērtēšanu un kompensācijas izmaksāšanu.

Palīģiestādes un lēmēģiestādes savstarpēji sazinās valodās, **kurās tās ir atzinušas par pieņemamām**. Informācija par pieņemamajām valodām ir atrodama pie tās dalībvalsts, kuras iestādei ir nosūtīta informācija saistībā ar lietu (piemēram, pieteikums, lēmums vai citi paziņojumi).

**Lai iegūtu sīkāku informāciju par konkrētu valsti, noklikšķiniet uz tās karodziņa.**

Palīģiestādēm un lēmēģiestādēm palīdz **valsts centrālais kontaktpunkts** (lūdzu, izvēlieties "Centrālais kontaktpunkts" meklēšanas rīkā zemāk), kura uzdevums ir veicināt sadarbību starp iestādēm, sniegt palīdzību un meklēt risinājumus pārrobežu situācijās.

**Compensation to crime victims - Denmark**

**Languages for the transmission of applications**

The Criminal Injury Compensation Board (*Erstatningsnævnet*) accepts Danish or English for applications to Denmark.

Denmark has concluded a Language Convention with the other Nordic countries, i.e. Finland, Iceland, Norway and Sweden, under which citizens of these countries may use their own language in another Nordic country. The languages included in the Convention are Danish, Finnish, Icelandic, Norwegian and Swedish.

#### Application forms for compensation

In Luxembourg, people seeking compensation are not required to complete a specific form.

Victims of a crime simply need to send a letter giving the date, place and details of the crime.

They should enclose copies of any documents in support of their compensation claim (copy of the police report, any court decisions that may have been handed down, supporting documents proving their total incapacity for work, permanent disability, increase in outgoings or reduction in income, and documents describing their disability, to ensure that they receive effective and adequate compensation from the offender).
