## Despăgubirea victimelor infracționalității

Informații la nivel național și formulare online referitoare la Directiva 2004/80/CE

### Informații generale

#### Directiva 2004/80/CE a Consiliului din 29 aprilie 2004 privind despăgubirea victimelor infracționalității

Directiva se aplică între toate statele membre ale Uniunii Europene.

Aceasta prevede că fiecare stat membru al UE instituie un sistem național de despăgubire a victimelor infracțiunilor săvârșite cu intenție și prin violență. În conformitate cu directiva, toate victimele infracțiunilor săvârșite cu intenție și prin violență au acces la sistem național de despăgubire în statul membru pe teritoriul căruia a fost săvârșită infracțiunea.

Pentru a ajuta victimele să primească despăgubiri în cazurile transfrontaliere, directiva stabilește un sistem de cooperare între autoritățile naționale:

Persoanele care sunt victime ale infracționalității pe durata șederii în străinătate (într-un alt stat membru al UE decât cel în care trăiesc) pot depune o cerere la **autoritatea responsabilă cu asistența** din statul în care trăiesc (Vă rugăm să selectați „autorități responsabile cu asistența” din meniul de căutare de mai jos).

Autoritatea responsabilă cu asistența traduce și transmite cererea **autorității de decizie** din statul membru în care a fost comisă infracțiunea (Vă rugăm să selectați „autorități de decizie” în meniul de căutare de mai jos). Autoritatea de decizie este responsabilă de evaluarea cererii și de plata despăgubirilor.

Autoritățile responsabile cu asistența și autoritățile de decizie comunică între ele în **limbile pe care le-au acceptat**. Pentru a găsi informații cu privire la limba (limbile) acceptată (acceptate) ar trebui să verificați ce informații a furnizat în acest sens statul membru a cărui autoritate este competentă să primească informațiile pertinente în speță (de exemplu, cererea, decizia sau alt tip de comunicare).

**Pentru informații detaliate de la nivel național, selectați drapelul țării care vă interesează.**

Autoritățile responsabile cu asistența și autoritățile de decizie sunt sprijinite de către **punctele de contact centrale** naționale (Vă rugăm să selectați „punct de contact central” în meniul de căutare de mai jos), al căror rol este de a promova cooperarea între autorități, de a oferi asistență și de a căuta soluții în situații transfrontaliere.

Portalul european e-justiție vă oferă informații privind aplicarea directivei și vă pune la dispoziție un instrument ușor de utilizat de completare a **formulelor**.

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### Compensation to crime victims - Czechia

#### Languages for the transmission of applications

Applications must be made in Czech.

#### Application forms for compensation

Applications may be made using the form that can be found on the [website of the Czech Ministry of Justice](#). However, use of the form is not compulsory and the application procedure can be started on the basis of any submission which clearly seeks the grant of monetary assistance for a victim of crime.

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### Compensation to crime victims - Denmark

#### Languages for the transmission of applications

The Criminal Injury Compensation Board (*Erstatningsnævnet*) accepts Danish or English for applications to Denmark.

Denmark has concluded a Language Convention with the other Nordic countries, i.e. Finland, Iceland, Norway and Sweden, under which citizens of these countries may use their own language in another Nordic country. The languages included in the Convention are Danish, Finnish, Icelandic, Norwegian and Swedish.

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### Compensation to crime victims - Germany

##### Application forms for compensation

In Luxembourg, people seeking compensation are not required to complete a specific form.

Victims of a crime simply need to send a letter giving the date, place and details of the crime.

They should enclose copies of any documents in support of their compensation claim (copy of the police report, any court decisions that may have been handed down, supporting documents proving their total incapacity for work, permanent disability, increase in outgoings or reduction in income, and documents describing their disability, to ensure that they receive effective and adequate compensation from the offender).

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#### Compensation to crime victims - Slovakia

##### Languages for the transmission of applications

Section 20(1) of Act No 274/2017 on victims of crime and amending certain acts states that '*the documents and information referred to in Sections 18 and 19 shall be transmitted in the official language, or in one of the official languages, of the Member State whose authority is being addressed, or in another language whose use has been approved by that Member State, with the exception of the following:*

(a) *decisions taken by the decision-making body, which shall be drawn up in the language determined by its legal order;*

(b) *statements made by victims of a violent crime or by other persons referred to in Section 18(6)(b) and Section 19(4)(b), which shall be drawn up in the language of the Member State, as determined by its assisting authority.'*

Section 20(2) of Act No 274/2017 states that '*subject to the conditions referred to in paragraph 1, documents and information addressed to the Slovak authorities shall be transmitted in Slovak and English.*'
